Burundi has officially inaugurated the country's first utility-scale solar field, as part of push to leverage renewable energy for improved access to electricity for homes and businesses.

The grant will support Weza Power, a public-private partnership (PPP)-backed private utility aiming to rapidly expand electrification and connect nine million people across Burundi.

Current Status un-try. While 63% of the urban population have access to electricity, in rural areas only 3% have electricity

This project is expected to address this gap by expanding grid connectivity in rural Burundi, leveraging renewable energy supply that will be integrated into the grid in the coming years.

A new World Bank-financed project will support the increase of electricity access in Burundi and help to improve the country's energy sector performance.
