National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) Standard 855: Standards detailing the requirements for mitigating the hazards associated with energy storage systems (ESS).

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While NFPA 855 is a standard and not a code, its provisions are enforced by NFPA 1, Fire Code, in which Chapter 52 outlines requirements, along with references to specific sections in NFPA 855.

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
